Claudia Tenney Said What?

Representative Claudia Tenney was recently quoted in a NNY360 story as discounting the notion that the Jan 6 insurrection was a big deal or a “major, negative event” in American history. As my kids would say – “wait, what?”

A violent mob attacked police trying to prevent their entry, injuring over 140 police officers. Ironically, some insurrectionists used flagpoles to beat police. The violence continued inside where the rioters desecrated the symbol of our Country. Meanwhile, outside the Capitol, gallows were built to hang the Vice President. Yes, Representative Tenney, if you had been there, you would have been huddling on the floor with other Congresspersons, fearing for your life and only saved by a final stand of DC and Capitol police.
